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Legislative principles

- Nature conservation = concurrent competence
 - Both national and provincial spheres of government have the legal mandate to develop and implement conservation legislation
 - National legislation does not automatically prevail over provincial legislation
 - \circ Constitution provides for the resolution of conflict (section 146)
- Functional Areas of Concurrent National and Provincial Legislative Competence = Schedule 4 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa
- Necessary empowering provisions must be provided in NEMBA







Legislative principles

Legislative tool	Enabler	Example
NEMBA	To prohibit, regulate or exempt a restricted activity (RA)	 Permit required to hunt a leopard Prohibited to collect cycads from the wild
Regulations (TOPS and CITES Regulations)	Prohibit a RA in certain circumstances	Prohibit the hunting of a listed large predator in a controlled environment
Norms and Standards (section 9 intends N&S to be enforceable)	How a RA may be carried out	 Parameters in which a leopard may be hunted Specifications for keeping of an elephant

Revised N&S for the management of elephants in South Africa	To be re-published for implementation	
N&S for the trophy hunting of leopard in South Africa	together with the finalised revised TOPS Regulations and species list	
N&S for management of elephant, rhino, lion and leopard	To be initiated in April 2024

Plans (BMP) for white and black	 U1 September 2023 Draft BMPs are being developed
Review of BMP for lion	Procurement process to appoint a service provider is in process
Leopard Conservation Strategy	in processLong-term goal is to develop a Biodiversity
South Africa	 Phase 2: Research work by UPE and UKZN completed; stakeholder consultations held in 2022
National Elephant Heritage Strategy	 elephants completed – 2021/2022 First draft of the strategy is ready for another round

Draft National Vulture BMP	 Inter-governmental structure consultation underway to seek approval.
